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#### **BUILDING & GROUNDS REMINDERS**

As the 2024 Season approaches, we'd like to everyone to be aware of a parking change, yard & household waste, and a few reminders that are in our Good Neighbor Policy These and other tid-bits of information can be found on the MVCMA web site <a href="https://www.mvcma.org/cottage-owner">https://www.mvcma.org/cottage-owner</a>

We are adding back the 2nd 30 minute **parking spot in Montgomery Square**, but in a new spot to left of the walkway to Circuit Ave at Sharky's.

Branches and Clippings If you're cleaning up your yard and have branches or clippings that won't fit in your recycling bag, they must be tied up in a manageable bundle for the grounds crew to pick up. Leave bundle on the side of the road at your cottage and it will be picked up.

**Trash Pick Up** All purple trash bags must be put out in barrels for pick up. Do not just put out bags. If you have renters, please make sure they are also aware of this.

**Bird Feeders** Bird feeders are not ideal for the close proximity of neighbors in the Campground but if it's your thing, please be mindful that some unwanted critters may come to dine as well so keep an eye on them. If that happens bring your feeder in for a few days and then try again.

Sealing Around Your Cottage As you return for the season, take a look around your cottage to see if there are obvious areas where critters can get under your cottage and take up residence. Try to seal up any areas to stop this from happening. If you need help with removal of unwanted guests (skunks) here are a couple of on-island skunk wranglers you can hire. These are just from online searching, not direct recommendations from MVCMA.

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#### **BUILDING & GROUNDS REMINDERS CONTINUED...**

**Exterior Lighting** LED Bulbs should be "warm" style 2700k-3000k not daylight "bright white" type.

Motion lights are discouraged but if needed they should not be activated by neighbors, trees moving, vehicles or people passing by on roads or walks. They should be low-level (brightness) lighting.

**Porch Lighting** String lights as shown are discouraged as they detract from the cottage appearance



Warm White LED Fairy Lights are a good option as they are small and can be easily concealed while still providing ample light.

Reminder that **pets are to be kept on leash at all times** and are not allowed in Trinity Park. Please clean up after your pet and dispose of waste properly.

### Construction Wrap-up & Work Hours

If you have work underway on your cottage (construction, painting, landscaping, etc), please make sure all your contractors know that because June 30 is a Sunday, Saturday June 29th at 6 PM is the deadline for all work. This includes clean-up and removal of all equipment and materials.

Cottage Owners are allowed to work on Sundays, after 12 noon until 6 PM through June.

July & August cottage owners can mow lawns after 12 PM until 6 PM. If it is at all possible, please try to do this work during the other days of the week.

Exterior security cameras, doorbell cameras, etc are not allowed in the Campground. If used in the cottage they must be set up in a way that does not allow viewing beyond the cottage in public areas or other cottages.


